# Bermudian Springs School District News

### No Tax Increase for the 2021 - 2022 School Year

### **General Fund Budget**

The 2021- 2022 final budget adopted by the Bermudian Springs School District Board of Directors includes no property tax increase for district residents. The adjusted Act 1 index for the 2021-2022 school year for the Bermudian Springs School District is 4.10%.

The final budget reflects no increase in mills to balance the budget. The millage rate for the 21-22 school year will remain 12.4656 mills. The District will be transferring \$2,170,492 from the unassigned fund balance to offset the remaining deficit. The budget includes the following components:

Budgeted Expenditures: \$33,151,789 3.00% increase from current year

Anticipated Revenues: \$17,774,182 Local share of total budget \*57.37%

\$12,819,721 State share of total budget \*41.38% \$ 387,394 Federal share of total budget \* 1.25%

Our overall budgeted expenditures in the 2021-2022 final budget shows an increase of 3.00% from last year. Our District will experience an increase in mandated retirement contributions of \$96,398 from the 2020-2021 budget. Over the past nine years the District has experienced a total increase in mandated retirement contributions of \$3,123,194. In addition, the District will see a healthcare premium increase of 3.64%. Also, the District has realized an increase in tuition costs to cyber charter schools of \$211,373 more than the 2020-2021 budget for a total budget amount of \$1,201,373.
